1) Welcome & Introduction.....Marc Holcomb, RPO Coordinator

Marc Holcomb verified quorum for EB and TCC has been met based on sign-in sheets and gave a brief overview of the agenda.

2) Executive Board / Call to Order / Roll Call.....Clint Huth, EB Vice-Chairman

Clint Huth called meeting to order at 10:40am. Sign in sheets indicated sufficient attendance for quorum for EB.

3) Technical Committee / Call to Order / Roll Call..... Dan Evans, TCC Chairman

Can Evans called meeting to order at 10:40am. Sign in sheets indicated sufficient attendance for quorum for TCC.

4) Approval of Previous Minutes EB Meeting.....Clint Huth, EB Vice-Chairman

Motion to approve made by Keith Cartwright, seconded by John Gentry. Motion carried.

5) Approval of Previous Minutes TCC Meeting.....Dan Evans, TCC Chairman

Motion to approve made by Ben Burchfield, seconded by Tom Collins. Motion carried.

6) Southeast RPO Updates.....Marc Holcomb, RPO Coordinator

Marc Holcomb reminded attendees of the RPO website at sede.org/rpo and noted that some content from the TDOT project hub will be accessible via the RPO site. Multi-Modal Access Grant awarded to Spring City. Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainable Equity (RAISE) Grants awarded to Dunlap and Chattanooga. MMAGs have 95/5 or 90/10 match depending on applicant's economic status. Next MMAG application opens Spring 2023, exact date TBD. Next RAISE Grant application deadline is 2/28/23.

7) CTPR “New Start” Requests.....Marc Holcomb, RPO Coordinator

A copy of the CTPR Request Form is attached to these minutes.

Marc Holcomb explained that TDOT has a request form for submitting new project requests. Stacy Morrison with TDOT’s Office of Community Transportation (OCT) recognized TDOT staff present at the meeting: Robert Rodgers, Brian Hurst, Michael O’Donnell, Kevin Layne, Adam Casteel, Chanel Hippix, Joe Deering.

Stacy Morrison explained the need for a report containing high-level information, history, local perspective regarding a site when submitting a New Start request. This process is intended to get projects into the pipeline more quickly. TDOT Commissioner hopes to set up meetings with MPOs and RPOs during 2023. TDOT website updated with new information. New for project rankings this year is the addition of a “committed list” of projects that move to pipeline without being ranked.

8) TDOT Projects Presentation.....Brian Hurst, TDOT Transportation Manager

A copy of the project weighting criteria is attached to these minutes.

Brian Hurst gave a presentation about TDOT projects and encouraged everyone to look up TDOT i-Trip dashboard. ~\$900M budget reduced by \$90M due to lack of state revenue. ~\$500M is for maintenance and repairs. \$400M is for new projects. Effort to spread funds evenly around the state. Region 2 gets ~18% of funding, almost \$73M. Projects typically take roughly 12-15 years from proposal to completion. Beginning with FY23, any project on the approved list that goes to the governor is moved to the new “committed list.” TDOT’s goal is to complete committed projects within five years. Region 2 had three projects on the committed list. ~\$1.5B of proposed projects in Region 2. New focus on moving projects toward completion rather than phase to phase. Project rankings count for 11.8% of the overall calculations for committing projects.

Q&A: Partnering with TDEC for concurrent sewer and road improvement projects; Safety and improvements on SR27/Suck Creek Rd and why other roads in better condition receive more attention. Robert Rodgers with TDOT answered briefly and offered more detailed answers later.

9) TDOT Project Prioritization.....Marc Holcomb, RPO Coordinator

A copy of the project rankings list is attached to these minutes.

Marc Holcomb reviewed previous project rankings and explained TDOT updates to the list. 12 projects on the list: 3 Committed, 8 ROW/Construction, and 1 PE.

TCC was instructed to rank all 9 projects together rather than by phase.

Attendees asked for clarification regarding projects in Grundy and Bledsoe listed individually for ranking but are part of one overall large project. TDOT staff explained they are evaluated as multiple small projects. TDOT explained that spot improvements on the existing route have replaced plans for a bypass for Corridor K.

There are no wildlife crossings planned for Corridor K at this time, but a bridge installed in recent years was designed to allow wildlife to pass beneath.

10) Project Prioritization by TCC.....Dan Evans, TCC Chairman

Dan Evans asked members of the TCC to take a moment to complete the project ranking form.

11) Rural Regional Transportation Plan Presentation.....Chanel Hippix, TDOT Planning Specialist

A digital copy of the RRTP is available at sedev.org/rpo.

Chanel Hippix presented an overview of the final draft of the Rural Regional Transportation Plan (RRTP). This project officially kicked off in May 2020. The RRTP is a comprehensive document linking transportation and land use. The data in the plan can be used to bolster grant applications.

12) RRTP TCC Recommendation to EB..... Dan Evans, TCC Chairman

Motion to recommend adoption of RRTP made by Ben Burchfield, seconded by John Bamber.

13) RRTP EB Approval of TCC Recommendation.....Clint Huth, EB Vice-Chairman

Motion to recommend approval of project rankings made by Linda Hooper, seconded by Ben Burchfield. Motion carried.

15) Project Prioritization EB Approval of TCC Recommendation.....Clint Huth, EB Vice-Chairman

Motion to accept project rankings made by Lois Preece, seconded by Steven Sherlin. Motion carried.

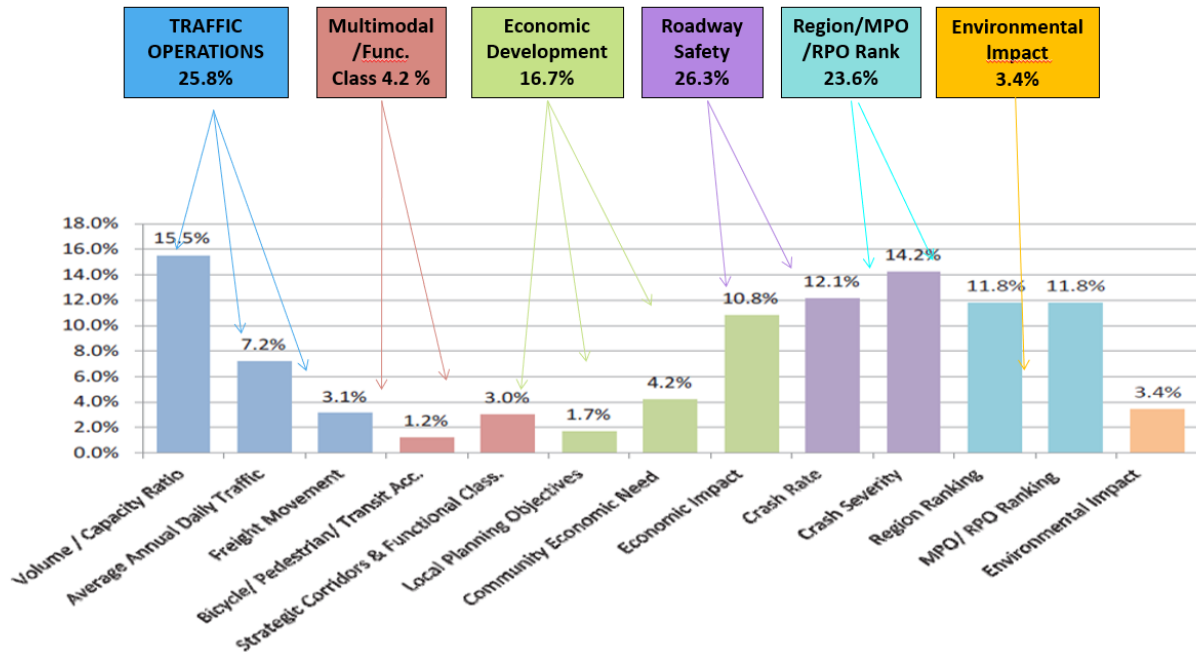
